This exhibition is the outcome of the Artist in Residence (AiR) @ Stepping Stone project which was launched at *Special Hands: Empowering Abilities Exhibition* held at the Star @ Pitt Street in December 2015. Think City was the catalyst in encouraging us to showcase the handiworks of members with intellectual disabilities from ACS Stepping Stone in Balik Pulau to the people of George Town for that one month exhibition.

The AiR project calls for emerging and established artists (local/overseas) to spend time working alongside the Stepping Stone members in developing further the creative and artistic potential of these individuals.

Shogo Ogoshi is our very first resident artist who arrived in Penang in June 2016. He enjoys the life style in rural countryside, eating local village food and working faithfully with the Stepping Stone members.

**"Kacau-Kacau"** became the natural theme for this joint exhibition as it was almost the first sounds Shogo heard from his initial interactions with the members at the ACS Stepping Stone Centre. He was curious to learn the meaning as it was always expressed with friendly smiles. *Kacau* or *ganggu* in Malay means 'disturb or bother', is often uttered by the individual members whenever someone comes near to view their work.

Hence, "**kacau-kacau**" a teasing term of endearment, became the bridge of communication between the members and Shogo. Thus, aptly chosen for this exhibition featuring artworks of mixed media .



**NUR FARINA ANUAR** (b 1988) joined ACS Stepping Stone Centre in 2014 and currently works in the craft section focusing on batik painting. She is a very diligent worker and able to do her tasks independently. Her drawings are her imaginations based on her life experiences. This is Farina's first public exhibition.



**OOI HUI YING** (b 1992) is a member of ACS Stepping Stone Centre since 2011. In 2014, she completed the vocational training in patisserie, under the Internship and Industry Placement for Special Needs Students program at Berjaya University College of Hospitality. Since then she has been working in the bakery section, specializing in bread-making. She also draws and this is the first time that her drawing is converted into a batik piece.



**NORAMI SALIM** (b 1976) is also one of the pioneering members who joined ACS Stepping Stone in the year 2000. As such, he is rather versatile craftsman having worked in the batik and weaving sections. He is currently working in the kitchen section. He has a vibrant sense of colours, enjoys music and is a natural dancer. His painting has been exhibited before but this is the first time his drawing is converted into a batik piece.

Soon after his arrival, Shogo began his art workshops in making puppets, collages, tracing art drawing and masks, engaging all members at the Stepping Stone Centre.


Some of these are on display at this exhibition. The colorful life-sized *teru-teru bozu* (traditional Japanese handmade dolls made with white cloth) is erected from numerous *teru teru bozu* wrapped in hand-painted batik fabric.

The two giant (3m x 3m) batik hanging art pieces have been jointly painted by Azril, Azliza and Izzudin. The waxed images are drawn by Seah Ciao Shen on paper and transposed by Shogo onto the cloth material. The colorful outcome is a stunning masterpiece produced with great fun and enjoyment.

Working with the members, Shogo was inspired by their individual art work which he found interesting, natural and spontaneous. He was able to guide some of them and this exhibition is a display of their efforts and journey together over this past nine months.

Besides the handiworks by these special artists, Shogo will also be exhibiting some of his own paintings drawn during his stay in Penang.
